We hope you have all had a lovely break and are ready for another busy half term! This half term, our topic is based around the **'Ancient Islamic Civilisation'** and the ancient city of Baghdad. We will be completing lots of exciting and interesting work in our Writing, History, Maths, Music, Science and Art.

English

In our writing lessons, we will be writing persuasive texts, linked to our class text. We will also be writing a narrative story. The grammar features we will continue to use in our writing will be colons, semicolons, relative clauses, cohesion between paragraphs and parenthesis, as well as passive voice and varied sentence structures.

Maths

This half term, we will be learning about fractions, decimals and percentages. We will then move on to calculating area, perimeter and volume of shapes. Finally, we will learn about statistics: pie charts, bar charts and calculating the mean average.

Reading

This half term, our class novel is 'The Golden Horsemen of Baghdad' by Saviour Pirotta. We will be exploring the text in detail and using it to answer different styles of comprehension questions.

Reading days

It is expected that children will read their book at least 3 times per week and have their planner signed by an adult.



Please can you make sure that your child brings their reading book and planner to school every day. In addition to this, please can you ensure you sign the planner at the end of each week.

PE

This half term, both classes will be playing **football** in their outdoor PE lesson and doing **gymnastics** sessions in the school hall. For outdoor PE sessions, children are welcome to bring in any warmer clothing such as jogging bottoms or a hoodie/ tracksuit. It is essential that all children wear non-branded, plain T-shirts and bring trainers or pumps on PE days. They are allowed to come to school in PE kit on PE days. Black coloured t-shirts, jogging bottoms and hoodies are allowed.
