Welcome to Year 1!

Miss Jeffreys and Miss Booth here! We hope you all had a lovely summer and have managed to have a good rest. We have loved getting to know the children and hearing all of the children's news from the summer. We're pleased to let you know that all children are settling in well to life in Year 1 and getting used to their new routines. It's a big change coming from Early Years and the children are eager to learn more and more. We still have lots of opportunities to learn through play as well as learning in the classroom by developing our maths, reading and writing skills.

English

Our writing unit this half term is all about Traditional Tales. Children will explore a series of traditional tales including; Rapunzel, The Princess and the Pea and our core text will be The Gingerbread Man. The children will learn to retell the story confidently, map out the Gingerbread Man's journey. We will also write a recipe on how to make your very own gingerbread man. Children will be immersed in the topic through drama and role-play. We will also be having daily phonics sessions and children will become secure in their Set 2 sounds. You will see a sound mat to help in your child's planner and QR codes will be sent home for extra practice.

Children will be learning about the place value of numbers. They will understand the place value of numbers initially up to ten. You can help at home by practising counting to 10 and beyond. We would also appreciate your support in helping your child to form their numbers correctly. There is a page in your child's planner which shows how to form the numbers! We will also be learning how to add and subtract numbers to ten using

You can help by:

- Reading with your child **everyday**
Listening to your child read and sharing stories with them is so important. Please ask questions about the book to check your child's understanding. The books taken home by the children are of a high quality so it's important to make the best use of them as they have been carefully matched to the reading level
- Practising new phonics sounds (access to QR codes given)
- Practising counting up to 100 in steps of 2, 5 and 10
- Forming numbers and letters correctly
