<p>In Maths, children will develop their knowledge of numbers up to 50. They will continue to use manipulatives and pictorial representations to support their learning and develop independence in using mathematical resources to aid understanding. Children will also further develop their addition and subtraction skills and practice writing number sentences, this time using numbers within 20.</p>	<p>This half term children will continue to develop confidence with their Set 2 and Set 3 sounds and develop further fluency when reading words 'at a glance'. They should be able to blend 4 sound and 5 sound words with greater confidence and read alien words using special friends, Fred talk, read the word. Children will also read more 'red words' and become confident in spelling these.</p>	<p>In writing, children will be exploring the theme of fantasy by learning our class text <i>The Tiger Who Came to Tea</i>. They will develop their descriptive writing skills by creating imaginative characters and settings, and practise using interesting vocabulary and varied sentences to bring their ideas to life. Children will also learn how to write a recount, using characters from the story to write a recount letter from the Tiger's point of view.</p>	<p>In Science, children will be learning about naming and describing materials. They will explore a variety of everyday materials and investigate their properties, using observations and simple tests to help them describe what they find. Children will also begin to compare materials, discussing why certain materials are suitable for specific purposes.</p>	<p>In PSHE, we will be learning about Health and Wellbeing and exploring the question "<i>What helps us stay healthy?</i>" We will look at how our bodies and minds are connected, and learn about healthy eating, regular exercise, good sleep, and looking after our mental health. We will also talk about the importance of positive relationships, managing feelings, and making safe, healthy choices in our everyday lives.</p>	<p>In History, children will be learning about the moon landings and significant people like Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin. They will explore key events in space and find out about the achievements of astronauts and scientists who made these historic journeys possible. Children will also consider how these events changed the world and inspired future generations.</p>
<p>This half term the children will continue to develop their skills using a Chromebook. They will learn how to log on to a laptop, navigate a keyboard and how to keep passwords safe. Children will learn how to follow simple instructions on a computer and learn about algorithms to make animated story books.</p>	<p>In Art this term, children will be exploring painting. They will investigate primary and secondary colours and learn a variety of painting techniques, including printing and different brush techniques. We will also look at the work of Clarice Cliff and how she used bold, vibrant colours to create striking patterns and designs.</p> 	<p>In Mastering Number, we will continue to strengthen our understanding of number bonds by exploring the composition of numbers within 10. We will use fun, practical activities to investigate how numbers can be made in different ways. We will also learn about odd and even numbers, and how to identify whether a number is odd or even.</p>	<p>In PE, children will be developing their sending and receiving ball skills. They will practice passing, catching, and controlling the ball with accuracy, using both hands and feet. Children will also work on coordinating their movements and responding quickly to others during games and activities.</p>	<p>In RE, we will be exploring the question "<i>What does it mean to belong to a church or a mosque?</i>" We will learn about Christianity and Islam, looking at how people show they belong to a faith community. Pupils will explore special places, symbols, and practices, and learn why churches and mosques are important to believers.</p>	<p>In Music, we will be exploring the theme of travel. Pupils will listen to and discuss music from different places around the world, exploring how music can represent journeys. We will use singing, movement, and percussion instruments to create and perform music inspired by travel.</p>
