<p>In maths, children will finish their learning on statistics, focusing on interpreting and presenting data clearly. They will then move on to shape, position and movement, exploring 2D and 3D shapes, symmetry, coordinates and simple transformations such as rotation and reflection. Practical activities will support their understanding and help them apply these skills confidently in different contexts.</p>	<p>In reading this half term, we will explore <i>Who Let the Gods Out</i> by Maz Evans. Children will develop their retrieval and inference skills, learning to find key information and read between the lines. They will also practise justifying their answers using evidence from the text, helping them to deepen their understanding and explain their thinking clearly.</p>	<p>In writing, children will begin by creating persuasive texts based on the myth of Theseus and the Minotaur. They will use emotive language to persuade Athenians to join the battle. As the unit progresses, they will develop their ability to structure arguments and engage the reader effectively.</p>	<p>In science, we will be learning about humans and the changes that happen as we grow into adults. Children will explore how the body develops over time, including physical and emotional changes. They will build their understanding through discussions and activities, helping them to recognise how humans grow and change throughout different stages of life.</p>	<p>In PSHE, children will explore the question ‘How do drugs, common to everyday life, affect health?’. They will learn about different types of drugs, including medicines, and understand how they can help or harm the body. Lessons will also focus on risks and staying safe, helping children make informed and responsible choices.</p>

<p>This half term, children will continue using Purple Mash to develop their understanding of databases. They will learn how to create their own database and explore how information can be organised. Children will also practise posing and answering questions using the data, helping them to build key computing and problem-solving skills.</p>	<p>In history, children will learn about the Ancient Greek civilisation, placing it on a timeline and ordering key events. They will explore how Greek society worked, including democracy, the Olympics, Athens and Sparta, and the Battle of Marathon. Children will compare aspects of ancient life with today, identifying similarities and differences.</p>	<p>In French the children will be learning how to describe things that are in their bedroom using prepositions.</p> <p>In Mandarin this half term we will be learning how to talk about school subjects and describe classroom objects.</p>	<p>In PE, children will be developing their skills in both tag rugby and tennis. They will focus on teamwork, passing and positioning in tag rugby, alongside control, accuracy and rallying in tennis. Through a range of activities and games, children will build confidence, fitness and apply their skills in different sporting contexts.</p>	<p>In music, children will explore a range of musical styles, moods and genres. They will listen to and discuss different pieces, identifying key features. The main focus will be on composing their own music, giving them the opportunity to be creative, experiment with sounds and perform their ideas confidently.</p>
