<p>This half term, Year 4 will focus on shape, statistics and position and direction. Children will learn to identify, compare and classify a range of angles and shapes, including quadrilaterals and polygons. They will explore lines of symmetry and complete symmetrical figures. In statistics, pupils will interpret and draw charts and line graphs. They will also describe position using coordinates and translate shapes on a grid, developing accuracy and problem-solving skills.</p>	<p>This half term, Year 4 will read Beowulf by Michael Morpurgo, alongside non-fiction texts about the Anglo-Saxons. Children will develop their comprehension skills through retrieval, inference and vocabulary questions. They will explore themes of heroism and conflict while learning how to support their ideas with evidence from the text</p>	<p>This half term, Year 5 are enjoying writing a wishing tale through our Talk for Writing unit. Children have been learning the story structure and key writing techniques before moving on to innovate and create their own versions. They will then design and explain their own invention.</p> <p>Pupils will also write an information text about a monster (e.g. Grendel), focusing on clear organisation, technical vocabulary and effective presentation.</p>	<p>This half term, pupils will explore how to manage risk in different places.
